





By comparison to other dinosaurs the velociraptor is shown as being smaller, but fast moving and with sharp teeth and claws that permitted it to attack other dinosaurs. A couple of pictures for identifying the velociraptor and an illustrated glossary are also included. Children will be fascinated by this unusual reptile.






Living in the Polar Regions



With prose that pirouettes off the page and onto the tongue, and a narrative that leaves the reader breathless, Pixley has crafted reality fiction that soap-operacizes the latest in the genre. Twelve-year-old Mirium is an intelligent poet who also manages to be an obnoxious, nosy, know-it-all, "individual." She finds herself within radar range of the popular crowd's mortars. Teased and harassed beyond the point of self-control, Mirium decides she needs a change. But the disastrous "change" only emphasizes her differences and leads to a confrontation with the most popular girl in school. Having brought her protagonist to the brink, with the young Shakespeare humiliated, degraded and mortified, Pixley then skillfully weaves an ending that is neither trite nor condescending.


